Public Policy

Public Policy Meetings will resume at 10:00 AM on Tues., Jan. 23rd at Mary Toutonghi's home at 4944 Rockland Way, Fair Oaks, CA 95628. Please RSVP to Mary's email: mtoutonghi@comcast.net. We have been focused on Lobbying and Advocacy, with an excellent workshop presented by Sue Miller in October. Traditionally, hour long meetings have worked well, keeping us centered on pertinent



topics, following an agenda suggested by members. Public Policy Action Priorities may be found on the AAUW Website as a guide and current affairs often spur passionate concerns that may direct our studies and actions.

In the past, "passionate concerns" have ensured our success. Perhaps this January meeting we would do well to select a topic and plan a strategy. Also, traditionally, Public Policy has handled our branch's October Meeting. We may wish to discuss that.

The National Women's History Museum, of which a number of us are Charter Members, has undertaken an important 3 year "State of the Curriculum" project. The NWHM will prepare a comprehensive research report and interactive tool exploring the state of women's history in the US state curriculums. Every state curriculum must and will be examined to find out how many times women are represented, where they are represented, and which women are mentioned.

No institution, no educational body has ever undertaken this massive task and until we can prove unequivocally that women are being left out of America's story --nothing will change. This is such an exciting message from outgoing President and CEO, Joan Bradley Wages. The implications are a mind-blower.

For many years AAUW has supported the National Women's History Museum and its struggle to obtain the right from Congress to build its museum on or near the National Mall. In between our many activities, checking the NWHM Website is so interesting and worthwhile! It always is a spirit lifter!

Next month we will resume Equal Rights Amendment issues!

CA AAUW will be re-voting on a very important issue January 9-11. The change in non-profit status requires a unanimous vote or cannot be implemented. CA AAUW in error had changed its status to a mutual benefit organization and now must make the change back to a public benefit nonprofit status or we will no longer be able to participate in Tech Trek or other important programs of AAUW. When you get your voting information in the mail or by email, be sure to read the in information provided. You need to know that if there are any "no" votes (even one) the measure will be defeated by constitutional requirement.

The last time we voted, there were 26 "no" votes which defeated the issue. Please be aware of the consequences and vote yes!
