MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



The Author's Luncheon was again at North Ridge Country Club. It was a beautiful sun-shiny day and the grass was bright green. Mary Toutonghi supplied lovely roses from her garden for each table. The author, Cheryl Stapp, talked about her fascinating

books about the history of the Sacramento Valley, especially about the first women to arrive at Sutter's Fort. Those women are awe-inspiring for both traveling through and dealing with the unknown and also bearing and raising children while doing so. Quite amazing!

We voted in a new slate of officers at the Author's Luncheon. We have a wonderful group of women making up next year's board. I thank them for offering their time and energy to AAUW and to our branch. We cannot work to improve the lives of women and girls without those of us who work to make it happen, year after year. Thank you!

Lee Battershell Baird will be our new president and you will be hearing from her soon. She and I will be attending the AAUW California Conference; we will be sharing what we learn with all of you. We will both be at the Public Policy workshop there. Our own Charmen Goehring is Chair of AAUW CA Public Policy and will be presenting at the conference.

Lee and I will work with our CHAR group to help make changes right here in our Sacramento area, based on what AAUW CA advocates for. AAUW CA has co-sponsored two bills that are moving through our state legislature. They are SB 1284 on pay transparency, and AB 2282, which refines the language now in law from previous efforts on prohibiting employers from asking for prior salary in the job interview process, and from using it discriminatorily should they obtain it.

Equal Pay Day was April 10, 2018. We have recently learned that at the current rate of change, women will not achieve equal pay with men in the U.S until more than 100 years from now. We must work to make that happen much faster! I encourage you to join our new Public Policy interest group to find out how you can help improve the lives of women and girls.



Public Policy

On March 13th an important press conference was held by A STRONGER CALIFORNIA on the south steps of the Capitol. AAUW has lent its support to this group in the past when several members from CHAR were encouraged by our state representative Sue Miller to attend another informative meeting at the Capitol last year.

The Stronger California Advocates Network presented the Launch of its 2018 Legislative Agenda. The event highlighted 2018 priority bills addressing sexual harassment, fair

pay and job opportunities, poverty, child care and family-friendly work places. The mission of the organization is to secure economic opportunity for all women.

The various bills that were highlighted included: SB 1284 and AB 2282 which strengthens equal pay protections; SB 937: lactation accommodations; SB 982: ends deep childhood poverty; SB1300 and SB1038: retaliations, protections; AB 1870: extends filing deadline for harassment claims; and increased funding for childcare.

Thank you to Mary Duval for stepping forward and agreeing to oversee the Tech Trek Committee next year. While it is a joint effort and a wonderful group of CHAR members are participating, it is essential to have someone at the helm to keep track of the pro-

gress and make sure all the "i"s are dotted and the "t"s are crossed!

Thanks to Aerojet Rocketdyne and Golden State Water for once again donating a scholarship each. We now have an assurance of at least three girls for next year's camp.

The September Membership Luncheon is the meeting in which the current summer campers are introduced and invited to share their experiences with CHAR members. And, October is the month when we must notify U.C. Davis of the number of girls we can send for the following year. Therefore, donations received at the September meeting are the final determination of how many girls are chosen.

A little Tech Trek history

Marie Wolbach, an AAUW of California member, is credited with beginning Tech Trek in 1998. She had received an AAUW Community Action Grant and the rest is history!. Today, 20 years later, AAUW Tech Trek operates at 22 different sites around the United States. Ten of those sites are in California alone.



Statistics indicate that Tech Trek alumnae complete Pre-Calculus at a rate of twice the national average and they complete Algebra II at a rate higher than either male or female students in general.
