PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



On November 7, 1944, my father refused to drive my mother to the polls because she wanted to vote for Franklin D. Roosevelt. Mom said, "My mother couldn't vote because the law wouldn't let her. I can, and you're not going to stop me." I was too young to understand. As I grew older and learned the

story, I was sooo proud of my mother. She let dad pay for the round-trip taxi ride.

On November 6, 2018, I get to vote and you better believe I will be there. We have the privilege of voting because many brave women before us fought to pass the 19th Amendment that was approved June 4, 1919, and ratified August 18, 1920. As we watch the political movement in the United States we realize how important our vote is. As National said, "from our paychecks, to paid leave, access to reproductive health care and access to education, our lives are on the line—but more often than not, those conversations lack women's voices."

We have many tools to help us support the right candidates and support the right issues including the AAUW Voter issue guide and the forum that Charmen, PJ, Mary Toutonghi, and the Sacramento AAUW formed to bring us Professor Moylan and her McGeorge Law students who researched and presented the pros and cons to us October 13. Thank you all. We need to keep fighting so that the scholarship winners you see in this issue will be able to use their education and support their children effectively.

We can't become complacent. We need to keep fighting to make sure the ERA is passed so women are recognized as equal under our constitution and so that Congress recognizes our votes and our voice. See you at the polls.

Featuring Dyanne Marte

Dyanne is the Department Chair of Fashion at American River College and the new Faculty Advisor for our AAUW-CHAR student group at American River College.

Dyanne Marte first began sewing and designing at the age of 12. She loved sewing so much that she changed her major from architecture to fashion while attending the Savannah College of Art and Design. At SCAD, she fell in love with knits while taking a course on designing active wear knits. After graduation, she moved to New York City to work for such

companies as NY & Co., J. Crew and Doncaster where she held positions in design, sourcing and development. While working, she studied design management at Pratt Institute.

After receiving her graduate degree in 2003, she moved to Baltimore, Maryland where she started her own label called Dennya. In Baltimore, she started teaching fashion at the Baltimore City Community College in 2005. She has also taught at Community College of Baltimore County. At Bowie State University, she co-wrote the curriculum for their fashion design concentration. She created 8 courses. After closing her label in 2014, Dyanne consulted as a designer and product developer for small labels until July 2016.

She's originally from Suriname in South America. Her family moved to the states in the late 70's and she grew up in the DC suburbs in Maryland.
